Recycling at a Glance

- Single Stream Recycling Curbside on Mondays. Do not bag materials
- Leaves & Brush Curbside in UNTIED BAGS or CONTAINERS on Fridays in April and November
- Christmas Trees

 Curbside of Fridays in January
- Metal Curbside 1st and 3rd Friday of the Month
- E- Waste Must be brought to the Public Works Garage
- Propane Tank \$5.00 per tank, drop off at Public Works
- Tires \$2.00 (no rim), drop off at Public Works
- Refrigerators & Freezers–\$20.00 per item. Doors must be removed.
- Air Conditioners- \$20.00 per item, drop off at Public Works
- Oil & Antifreeze—Must be brought to Public Works
- Hazardous materials will not be accepted at Public Works. Please call Ocean County Northern Recycling Center at 732-367-0802 for more information.

Trash Routes and Information

Tuesday, Trash 1 (T1)

South Side of Route 70, Chestnut Street, Manapaqua Avenue, Rose Street, Lilac Street, Lake Street and Barkers Village

Thursday, Trash 2 (T2)

North Side of Route 70, All Westlake Area, Maple Street, Oak Street, Poplar Street, Willow Street, Pinehurst Estates and Lakehurst Mobile Home Park

- If you trash/recycling collection falls on a holiday, it will be rescheduled to Wednesday of that same week.
- Garbage containers must weigh less than 50 pounds.
- Wood must be cut in four foot lengths, tied and no nails.
- Furniture will be collected on regular trash days, with a maximum of two pieces per collection. Please limit amount of non-household garbage put out. Excessive construction debris and whole house cleanouts will require a dumpster.



Residents are reminded to place their trash or recyclables curbside on the previous night to avoid missing collection.

Do not put trash or recyclables out sooner than the evening before collection day.
